Laurel, Md., Oct. 19.--The Sammie Liberty Bond Handicap was the outstanding feature of an ordinary card at Laurel Park today. Only four horses faced the starter in this event, and it was a walk for Crimper, the \$15,000 gold brook, who wins now and sometimes then. Fittlergold went to the post a heavy favorite, while Hauberk had a good following. Ticket shot to the front as the barrier was sprung and held this position until the stretch was reached. In the meanwhile Crimper was well in striking distance, and Hauberk third, while Fittlergold was trailing his field. Once straightened out for home, the Red Parr colt shot to the front and made the remainder of the field look as though they were tied to a pole. Ticket managed to stall off the determined winner of Hauberk while the favorite, Fittlergold, pulled up a bad last.

As the fourth race was being run a heavy downpour of rain came, which made the track heavy and holding. This was a signal for the "mudlarks" to get their work in. They proved themselves worthy of the name, for the remainder of the card was like the heavy going. A real good thing went over in the closing number when Graphic led his field from start to finish to win by four lengths from Baby Lynch. The latter was away poorly, and made up a world of ground and after reaching the winner at the head of the stretch hung, and second was the best she could do. Laurel, Md., Oct. 19.--"Billy" Burch, considered one of the best trainers on the American turf, will become a benedict shortly. He will marry a prominent young Baltimore lady. BUSINESS DEFEATED BY WESTERN ELEVEN
