"Gen. Allenby estimates the enemy's casualties up to date at 10,000 exclusive of prisoners."

Peking, Nov. 11.—The newspapers, which are the mouthpiece of the Chinese government, are today publishing a series of articles which are directed against the American "special interests" in China and which are intended to stir up the Chinese public opinion against the American position in the Far East.

LEON DRIVE BEING MADE TO ISOLATE ITALY

Rome's Confidence Regenerated by Creation of Inter-Allied War Board.

The faith of Italy has been regenerated by the formation of the inter-allied military committee, with Gen. Cadorna, Foch, and Wilson as members. Official dispatches received yesterday are credited with the opinion that Rome is not only regenerating its confidence but is also regenerating its military information has been forwarded here, but the latest news of an apparent success of the operations in the left wing of the Piave line has not diminished Italy's determination and enthusiasm.

World Isolate Italy. It is now asserted that the Germans are aiming a blow at the communications of Italy with France. Should the point of the German advance be thrust on through the Piedmont, it might prevent the movement of guns and reinforcements and cut the "leg" of Italy off from her allies.

Cadorna Still Is Hero. In Italian quarters, however, it is still believed that the battle line will be fought and won as the forces are now aligned. The effects of the inter-allied committee's appointment have already been felt in the Italian commanders. Younger men have been placed in charge.

Oil King's Speech. In Rome hotels run by German-Swiss have been closed. The proprietors are charged with participation in German propaganda.

Trotsky's New York Pals Sketch His Vivid Career

Associates in Publishing of Russian Socialist Paper Tell How Bolshevik Chief Fought Authority.

Frederick M. Kerby, New York, Nov. 11.—I have just come from the cellar at 77 St. Mark's place, in the heart of New York's East Side, where Leon Trotsky, the man who has overthrown the Kerensky government in Petrograd, for three months edited the little Russian revolutionary Socialist paper, Novy Mir, the organ of the Russian branch of the Socialist party in America.

Chairman of Bolsheviks. He is identified with the Bolshevik group, and was elected chairman of the Bolshevik convention recently held in Petrograd. "He was arrested in July by the Kerensky government, after the uprising in Petrograd, but was released, and took a prominent part in the so-called Democratic convention about a month ago. He was the leader of the left wing in that convention.

Quick Action Wanted. "The provisional government consented to the distribution of land, long ago, but they want to wait until the constitutional assembly shall solve that problem. The Bolsheviks want the assembly to convene at once. That is their third demand. The land owners want the constitutional assembly delayed until the war is ended.

Austria's Aims Unchanged. Amsterdam, Nov. 11.—In discussing the sojourn in Berlin of Count Czernin, Austro-Hungarian foreign minister, the Fremdenblatt, of Vienna, in a leading article, apparently inspired by the program of the Austro-Hungarian Empire remains unaltered and is directed toward a speedy and honorable peace.

How to Send Christmas Boxes to Men on American Warships. The Navy Department yesterday gave instructions how to send Christmas boxes to men with the fleet. Here they are:

- 1. All mail matter should be addressed as prescribed in the postal regulations; all express matter, care of Supply Officer, Navy Yard, New York.
2. The name of the sender should be on every box, together with the words "Christmas Box" or "Christmas Present."
3. All boxes should be in New York not later than November 24.
4. Parcel Post packages should be enclosed in boxes with hinged or screw top. Express packages must not weigh more than twenty pounds. No perishable food, unless canned or in glass jar, could be placed in the packages. All express packages must be of wood and are limited to two cubic feet in volume.

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HON ATROCITIES WOULD MAKE SATAN BLUSH

So Says Rev. J. L. Gordon in "How Germany Lost Her Soul."

"The devil in hell would blush for some of the things Germany has done in this war," was the vehement declaration of Rev. James L. Gordon, pastor of the First Congregational Church, in his sermon last night after reciting many of the counts in his indictment of Kaiserism. "How Germany Lost Her Soul" was the subject of his discourse, taking for his text Prov. viii, "He that sinneth destroyeth his own soul." To say that the Kaiser got all that was coming to him is putting it mildly.

Belgium Saves Soul. Dr. Gordon began his onslaught on Kaiserism by declaring that Belgium had saved her soul by refusing to have part or partnership in a dishonorable transaction, and her reward was security for her honor for a thousand years.

Ten Years' Comparison. Firing on men and women struggling in the water; German vessels setting signals of distress and then firing on those who came to save; robbing women and children to screens and making the march behind the "brave" troops of Germany as shields; how a train load of prisoners three days without bread or water were met at a station by German women who after holding the water just out of their reach spilled it on the ground and then spat in the faces of the prisoners, were a few of the horrors recited.

U. S. WILL CALL FOR MORE MEN IN MARCH

Second Draft Follows Reclassification of First 9,000,000. A second draft will almost certainly follow immediately upon the reclassification of the 9,000,000 men not called in the first draft, according to the view in official circles yesterday. The exact date has not yet been decided upon, but indications were that the call will be made about March 1. This will permit of an additional fifteen days over the period of sixty days allotted by President Wilson for the work of classifying the 9,000,000.

Drains Lake, Killing 20,000 Fish in Mud

Highland Falls, N. Y., Nov. 11.—Game Warden Kahl, of Orange County, is at Salisbury Mills investigating who let the water out of Salisbury Pond there and killed thousands of fish with which the place had been stocked. Some anglers, anxious to make a quick, easy haul of fish, opened the gates, and it is estimated that 20,000 fish, left in the mud, died. Leaves Child to Flames; Woman Leaps 2 Stories

New York, Nov. 11.—Awakened early today by flames spreading rapidly through the room in which she lay asleep with her baby, John, seven years old, Emma Schmidt, 25 years old, became panic stricken, ran to the window of a light shaft with the child in her arms, kissed him good-by, and leaving him in the burning room, leaped two stories to the stone paved alley. She is in a serious condition in the New York Hospital. The fire was quickly put out, causing trifling damage. The fire is believed to have been caused by the upsetting of a kerosene lamp in the room. It is thought that Mrs. Schmidt, finding means of escape by the door cut off, attempted to save her own and her child's life by jumping. Neighbors who ran out when they heard her screams implored her not to jump when she appeared at the window, but without avail.
