

MEXICO MAY DECLARE WAR AS U. S. ALLY

Carranza Considering Break with Germany—Oregon Conferring Here.

President Venustiano Carranza is considering a declaration by Mexico in favor of the allies. Should Mexico actively enter the war Gen. Alvaro Obregon, the victor over Villa, is understood to be willing to go back into the army and take command of an expeditionary force Mexico might send to Europe.

This role for Obregon is understood to be the chief motive of his present visit to Washington. He is avowedly pro-ally and eager for his country to espouse the allies' cause.

Carranza Also Pro-Ally. There is the best authority also for the statement in connection with Obregon's visit to Washington that President Carranza is also strongly pro-ally. In a quasi-official way his personal sympathies have lately been communicated to the State Department.

Some who have presented the question of Mexico's continued neutrality to President Carranza assert that he has voted personal sympathy for the allies without qualification.

Obregon's visit to Washington at this time will put his possession of the military information necessary to carry out any war plans that may result from Carranza's final decision.

Natural Ally of U. S. The natural ally of Mexico, notwithstanding the views of some Mexicans, is the United States, Carranza has been emphatically told by advisers, is not and never can be Germany.

D. C. Draftees Will Entrain Next Monday

Increment of 417 Ordered to Report for Journey to Camp Meade.

Washington men drafted under the April call, to the number of 42, will leave here Monday for Camp Meade, Md., the Provost Marshal General Crowder announced last night in a statement designating the camps to which the men called to the colors under the April quota would be assigned.

Negroes Follow. The District also will be sent to Camp Meade for training as will others from Tennessee and Pennsylvania, but no Maryland negro draftees will be assigned to Meade.

Advance train arrangements already have been made and reports received by the provost marshal general give assurance that the movement of the men will proceed with great ease and dispatch than any heretofore.

The 417 white men called for report at the City Post office Building, near Union Station, at 8 o'clock Sunday night, when they will be formerly inducted into the military service of the country and given final instructions as to where to report and when for their departure for camp Monday morning.

ASK CONGRESS TO RECOGNIZE D.C. GUARDSMEN

Gen. Simms Offers Statistics Showing Value of New System.

Interesting data relative to the bill now before Congress, proposing plans for reorganizing the District National Guard, is contained in a memorandum sent out by Brig. Gen. Richard D. Simms, commanding the same. Augmenting and maintaining the strength of the District militia during the period of the war are the objectives of the plan.

Special Class. "The special class desired to be enlisted," says the memorandum, "to be able-bodied professional and business men and men in the various government departments and business houses, who, under the present law, on account of age or important business ties or family dependents, are not liable to perform foreign service, but who are capable and desirous of doing any local military service for which they may be needed."

Others Urge It. The advisability of filing the Department ranks of the District National Guard is urged by the War Department in addition to the Commissioners of the District of Columbia, Chamber of Commerce, Board of Trade, Retail Dealers' Association and other bodies.

In a statement made before United States Attorney Arth, Miller claims that he is an American citizen, coming to America with his parents from Germany when he was five years old.


