LATEST CASUALTY LIST Shows 75,820 Dead. Casualties in the A. E. F. reported up to April 26 were 286,746, the War Department announced yesterday. These casualties were divided as follows: Killed in action, 32,957; died of wounds, 14,211; died of disease, 23,102; died of other causes, 4,550; total dead, 75,820; taken prisoner, 4,786; missing in action, 4,293 and wounded, 201,547.
