GRAND JURY ENDS TERM, RETURNING 64 INDICTMENTS

Wide Variety of Crime Covered in Oct. Session. One Murder Charge.

The outgoing grand jury yesterday wound up its dealings with the District Attorney's office by returning sixty-four indictments ranging all the way from false pretense to first degree murder.

John R. Allen, colored, was indicted for first degree murder in connection with the death of Hallie Cochran, an 18-year-old colored girl, on October 26 last.

Henry Maywood and Sandy Crooks were indicted on charges of manslaughter in connection with the death of William H. Glover, an inmate of St. Elizabeth's on September 27 last.

Mrs. Marjorie Chew, wife of Capt. Grayson Beverly Chew, who had already been indicted once for grand larceny, was indicted again yesterday on a similar charge.

Seven Alleged Burglars Held. Joseph Homer, alias Joseph Hughes, and William A. Randall, alias Thomas Nagle, were jointly indicted on charges of assault with intent to kill and assault with a dangerous weapon, growing out of the alleged shooting of Detective Frank Alligood and Edwin Monk.

Three alleged delinquent husbands were indicted for nonsupport of their wives and minor children. Other indictments were returned for stolen property, perjury, false pretenses, violations of the prohibition and narcotics acts, grand larceny, assaults with deadly weapons, joyriding, forgery, white slavery, postal regulations, blackmail.

WIFE MUST KEEP PRENUPTIAL PACT WAIVING FORTUNE

Appellate Court Holds Valid Mrs. Snow's \$30,000 Dower Settlement.

Mrs. Addis H. Snow, wife of Chester A. Snow, millionaire patent attorney, of Woodside, Md., according to a decision of the Court of Appeals yesterday must live up to a prenuptial agreement between herself and Snow, whereby she waived her dower rights in his estate for a consideration of \$30,000.

Associate Justice Robb dissented from the opinions of Chief Justice Smyth and Associate Justice Wan Ordell. He said, "It results therefore that this wife, a lady of character and refinement, has surrendered, without any actual reservation, her interest in an estate of more than \$1,000,000.

\$10,000 Injury Verdict Stands. Decisions of lower courts granting Lee Vandiver, of Fulton County, Ga., \$10,000 damages against the Seaboard Air Line for personal injuries received by the plaintiff as a result of the Supreme Court yesterday.

Court Orders Interior Head To Pay Indians

Ignoring a contention of John Barton Payne, Secretary of the Interior, that the Osage Indians of Oklahoma, might squander the \$21,000,000 due them on leases and sales of oil lands in that State, the Court of Appeals yesterday directed that the Secretary pay this money to the adults of the tribe.
