MONTGOMERY G.O.P. OFFERS SLATE FOR COMING PRIMARIES

E. L. Stock Heads List as Candidate for State Senatorship.

ROCKVILLE, Md., Aug. 9.—Montgomery County Republicans, in convention at Beech Hall here this afternoon, placed themselves on record as favoring the following as nominees for the various offices to be filled in the county next fall: State senator—Edward L. Stock, Bethesda.

Two hundred persons from all parts of the county, about one-third of them women, were present. Several women, including Mrs. Archibald Small, of Linden; Mrs. Eugene Stevens, of Chevy Chase; Mrs. Francis C. Getzmann, of Rockville; Charles F. Kirk, Olney, and James W. Johnson.

While the action of the convention does not preclude others than those selected from contesting at the primary election on September 5, it is not thought probable that any contests will develop, except that possibly Frank L. Hewitt, of Silver Spring, and Clifton Dronenburg, of Clarkburg, who were considered by the convention for places on the ticket, may try conclusions at the polls for county treasurer and clerk of the circuit court, respectively.

SECTION OF ROAD WILL BE REBUILT

ROCKVILLE, Md., Aug. 9.—As a result of the efforts of Dr. Benjamin C. Perry, of the board of county commissioners, the State Roads Commission has agreed to take over the road leading from Rockville to Potomac, a distance of five and two-fifths miles, and will soon reconstruct the road in its entire length.
