

JUDGES TO PICK DISTRICT QUEEN FROM GROUP OF 6

Capital Daughters Pass Before Critical Eyes At Arts Club.

These were called upon to appear before the judges in a group and stand at some distance away from the table so that the arbiters of feminine pulchritude might confer. After thirty minutes the judges were able to eliminate six from the list, leaving six in which the elements of personal beauty were so closely matched it was impossible to draw the dividing line.

The six are the Misses Roach, Margaret Gorman, 2015 Cambridge place; Touart, Rogers, Talbert and McGrath.

Questioned by Judges. During the judging every effort was made to study the poise, grace and manner of the young candidates as well as their physical charm and each was adroitly drawn into conversation by one of the judges.

The judges realized that even a closer study was necessary in order to discriminate between the remaining six and repaired to a conference room in the club and interviewed each of the young women separately. They were closely interrogated as to their place of residence (as the winner must be a Washington girl) their education, ambitions and accomplishments.

When the judges had obtained all the information needed, they examined the young women and announced that a decision will be made today so that it can be announced tomorrow morning.

Lack of Jealousy. It was an interesting and happy group that gathered at the Arts Club and probably the happiest were the candidates, although they realized that only one of them could be successful. The rivals talked pleasantly with each other. There was not the slightest display of jealousy and some even wished their competitors success in case they failed.

There was the same spirit that is found among sportsmen on the eve of some great athletic contest.

In the preliminary elimination the candidates stood at the doors and windows to watch as each young woman passed before the judges and when the elimination had reached twelve they came out in the garden and stood about watching the interesting group. Each of those who had been eliminated selected a favorite from the remaining few and wished her well. Even when the elimination had reached six the candidates displayed the same fine spirit.

Many amusing incidents occurred. The judges were seeking rather than artificial beauty, and noticing too much "make-up" on a young woman asked her to remove it and come back. She was selected as among the twelve prettiest.

Also there was Miss Margaret Gorman to cause the judges confusion. Although they are not related, there was a similarity in their costumes and general appearance. Both were exceptionally attractive and were among the last twelve.

Quite a few were eliminated because they were not bona fide residents of Washington. This does not mean native born, but a residence in the city covering a period of at least three years.

The judges are: Dr. Mitchell Carroll, vice president of the Arts Club and editor of Arts and Archaeology; Dr. Tom Williams, of the Arts Club; Arthur Musgrave, of the Arts Club, a well known painter; Harry Stevens, of Bachrach studios; Lawrence Featus, of Loew's Palace Theater and Julian Brylawski, of the Cosmos.

Too much can not be said of the Arts Club for its very hospitable reception to the candidates and to the judges' patience and painstaking study of the difficult problem before them.

CORPORAL JACOBS' BODY DUE TUESDAY

Local Man Killed in Late War to Be Buried in Arlington.

The body of Corporal Charles Thet Jacobs, of the Marine Corps, who was killed in action in France will arrive in Washington Tuesday and will be interred in Arlington National Cemetery with military honors. The body will be in state at the Government Printing Office from the time of its arrival until the public funeral services, which will be held there at noon Wednesday. The Second Division, U. S. M. C., stationed at Quantico, will attend in a body.

Jacobs enlisted in the Marine Corps December 16, 1917, and went to France with the 13th Replacement Company. At the time he was killed, he was attached to the Twenty-sixth Company, Sixth Regiment, Second Division of the Marine Corps. He was gassed on June 14, 1918, and was killed in an attack on Mount Blanc ridge in the Champagne sector.

Corporal Jacobs is the son of Mrs. Roberta Jacobs, of the Cairo apartments, and the late William Jacobs. He was a native of Washington and attended the local public schools. Besides his mother, he is survived by three brothers, Robert and Walter Jacobs, of this city, and William Jacobs, of New Orleans; and three sisters, Mrs. J. T. Howard, Misses Mabel and Rose Jacobs.

G. O. P. Woman Is Proposed For Secretary of New Department.

Mrs. Harriett Taylor Upton was yesterday recommended for secretary of the proposed Department of Public Welfare by Mrs. Ellis Meredith at the monthly luncheon forum of the Woman's City Club in the clubrooms, 22 Jackson place.

Mrs. Upton worked prominently for suffrage, headed the Republican Women of America in the last Presidential campaign and is now vice chairman of the Republican national executive committee.

Mrs. Meredith urged the placing of Mrs. Upton's name before President Harding, "before some man is slated for the secretaryship of this department to which the President is committed." The nomination was regarded as nonpartisan as Mrs. Meredith has been attached to the

National Democratic committee as field worker and speaker.
