**THREE DIE IN WEEK
IN AUTO ACCIDENTS**

David Finch, 7 years old, 1313 Emerson street northwest, who was struck by an automobile early Thursday morning at the entrance to an alley on Emerson street, suffering from a fractured skull, died early yesterday morning at the Sibley Hospital without having regained consciousness. Maj. H. Robb, 1306 Farragut street northwest, driver of the machine which fatally injured the boy, was exonerated by a coroner's jury yesterday morning. A certificate of accidental death was issued.

The death is the third from traffic accidents in the District this week. Ralph Barronto, 9 years old, 308 C street southwest, was killed by a motor

truck at Seventh street and Pennsylvania avenue northwest, Monday, and Lawrence D. Madden, colored, 3 years old, 1434 D street southeast, was killed by a delivery truck Wednesday.
