

JOINT SESSION AT ALEXANDRIA AGAIN DEFEATED

Selection of Four School Trustees and Fire Chief Postponed.

ALDERMEN DECLINE

Give No Reason for Action. Large Grist of Business Transacted.

Douglas, 727 King Street, Alexandria, Va., Oct. 25.—At the session of the city council tonight, the board of aldermen again refused to grant a joint session with the common council for the election of four school trustees and a fire chief. Terms of the trustees and chief expired some time ago and action to fill the vacancies has been postponed from time to time. No reason was given by the aldermen for their refusal.

The resignation of Herman Kaufmann, member of the common council from the second ward for the past several years, was accepted. A resolution to reimburse the three barge-men in the city for erroneous tax assessment amounting to \$10,491.10, including First National, \$4,985.47; Citizens National, \$4,236, and Alexandria National, \$1,248.74, was referred to the finance committee.

Resolution appropriating \$500 for improvement of road on North Fairfax street, leading to the plant of the Old Dominion Glass Company, was adopted. The aldermen wanted a similar amount used for improvement of the road leading to the cemetery on 17th street, from Alfred street.

It was later explained to them by a special committee that this would be done, whereupon they agreed to the passage of the resolution.

The sum of \$10 was appropriated for the installation of two electric lights in the back yard adjoining Duke street.

Petition for gutters in subdivisions in North Fairfax street, leading to the plant of the Old Dominion Glass Company, was referred to the finance committee.

Resolution appropriating \$1,400 to pay outstanding bills of the fire department, was referred to the finance committee.

The sum of \$147 was appropriated to purchase tires for the fire apparatus.

The city school board petitioned for improvement of the square on Washington street between King and Cameron streets, leading to the high school, and for auto speed limit to be placed at King and Cameron streets, and Patrick and Cameron streets.

Resolution that the salary of the clerk of the gas be increased from \$1,200 to \$2,000 a year was referred to the joint committee on light and finance.

Resolution of National Fruit Product Company for sewer on the 900 and 1000 blocks, Pendleton, and 600 block on North Henry street was referred to the committee on streets and finance. The health department recommended a sewer for that section, and this was referred to the same committee.

Albert Lee, an old resident, was stricken with a hemorrhage while at the corner of Washington and Cameron streets at 4:30 o'clock this afternoon and died before he reached the hospital. He was employed as a carpenter at the Washington Navy Yard. He lived in the Market Space with his son, James Lee, who, together with a daughter, Mrs. Alice Simpson, survive him. The body was taken to Whaley's mortuary chapel, where the funeral will take place at 3 o'clock Thursday afternoon.

SENATE.

Adopted committee proposal in revenue bill for continuation of normal tax rates of 4 per cent on \$4,000 of income and 5 per cent on all over that amount.

Repealed amendment by Senator Trammell exempting incomes of married persons up to \$1,500 and married persons up to \$3,000 and deeming exemptions on \$5,000 and \$15,000 incomes.

Adopted amendment by Senator Trammell providing that the only deductions allowed to taxpayers borrowing money to purchase or carry Federal securities shall be the difference between the amount of interest paid on the indebtedness thus incurred and that received on the securities.
