REPORTED FOR THE DAILY EVENING STAR. ONE WEEK LATER FROM EUROPE. Arrival of Steamship Atlantic NEW ERA IN THE CRIMEAN WAR.

New York, June 13.—The Atlantic arrived at half past eight o'clock this morning. She brings news of a highly important character. The Allies have taken Kertch, a fortress of the greatest importance, commanding the passage from the Sea of Azof into the Black Sea. They have also taken the Russian camp on the Tobernaya, besides several successes before Sebastopol.
