TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

The New York Legislature. ALBANY, Jan. 13.—The State Senate to-day passed a resolution requesting the President to make arrangements for the immediate exchange of prisoners. Bills were introduced in the House, appropriating \$25,000 to furnish the prisoners of this State, held by the rebels, with provisions, etc., and to support the volunteers' families by a State tax; and a resolution asking Congress for an appropriation for harbor and border defenses.
