THE ASSASSINATION. STATEMENT OF AN EYE-WITNESS. Mr. James P. Ferguson, who was present at Ford's on the night of the assassination, makes a statement to the following purport:

He went to the theater with a lady on Friday night for the express purpose of seeing General Ford, who was announced to be present. Mr. Ferguson or the President's party entered the box, but of course did not see the Lieutenant General. He, however, continued to watch the box, thinking the General might intend to slip quietly in, in order to avoid the demonstrations that would attend his recognition.

When the second scene of the third act of the play was reached, Mr. Ferguson saw (and recognized) John Wilkes Booth making his way along the dress circle to the President's box. Of this box Mr. Ferguson had an excellent view, being seated in the dress circle just opposite next to the private boxes on the other side of the circle. This reason was purposely chosen to afford his companion a good view of the Lieutenant General, and, for the reason stated, was narrowly watched.

Mr. Ferguson and Booth had met in the afternoon and conversed, and were well acquainted with each other, so that the former immediately recognized Booth as he descended two steps from the door, took off his hat, and holding it in his left hand leaned against the wall behind him. In this attitude he remained for a moment, then, adding Mr. Ferguson, he stepped down one step, put his hand on the door of the little corridor leading to the box, bent his knee against it, the door opened, and Booth disappeared for the time hidden from Mr. Ferguson's sight.

Mr. Ferguson watched for his appearance in the box, desiring to see who in that party the actor could be, but he saw no one, and he felt warranted in taking such a liberty. Whether Booth shut the door of the little corridor or left it open behind him, Mr. Ferguson did not know, but from what he observed on the door, and from what he hereafter to be stated, believes he did shut it. The shot was the next thing Mr. Ferguson saw. He saw the woman in the box standing upright, right with both hands raised, but at the moment saw no weapon or anything else in either. Booth then sprang to the front of the box, laid his right hand on the railing in front, was checked by the railing, and his coat or pants being caught in something, or held back by somebody. (It was by Major Rathbun.)

Just in front obstructed the view of Mr. Ferguson, but Booth soon changed his position, and again was clearly seen by Mr. F. He now had a knife in his right hand, which he also held in his left hand, and he sprang to the left, and vaulted on. As his legs passed between the folds of the flags decorating the box, his spur, which he wore on the right leg, caught in the folds of the flags, and he fell, falling on his right side, and clutching the shining knife. He crunched as he fell, falling on one knee, and his right hand on the railing in front, and covering an erect position, which he did with the rapidity and easy agility of an athlete.

Having recovered his equilibrium, Booth stood up, and he saw the woman in the box, passing behind the actor on the stage, Harry Hawk. When he reached the other side of the stage, just as he became invisible by passing behind the entrance, he took up, and Mr. Ferguson said he saw him say, "I have done it," and then he lost sight of him.

Mr. Ferguson visited the theater yesterday, and with Miss Harris, the lady who was in the box, and who was the witness in the trial of the Criminal Court, and Judge Carr, examined the box.

The puzzling hole in the unused door of the box was scrutinized by the light of a candle, and was found to possess indubitable marks of having been whittled with a knife. The hole was made in the wood of the door, and the edges of the hole show the marks of a knife-blade very clearly.

When the shot had been fired, Miss Harris placed a cloth to call for water for Mr. Lincoln, and directed the nurse to take the body to the rear of the box, and Mr. Ferguson saw the body of the President placed against the opposite side of the door frame. This bar, as the door opens inward, would effectually delay, if not wholly prevent, all further entrance of the dress circle, and would also detain the egress of any one in the box.

REWARD FOR THE CAPTURE OF THE ASSASSINS OF THE PRESIDENT AND SECRETARY OF STATE. Every effort that ingenuity, excited by fervor, can make, is being put forward by all the authorities to capture the assassins of Mr. Lincoln and Mr. Seward, and the members of the Common Council of the city who offered a reward of twenty thousand dollars for the arrest and conviction of the assassins. To this sum the city has added a further reward of \$10,000, making the whole reward thirty thousand dollars. To this announcement are added the following descriptions of the individuals accused.

Description of John Wilkes Booth, who Assassinated the President on the Evening of April 14, 1865. Height, 5 feet 10 inches; weight, 160 pounds; compact build; hair, jet black, inclined to curl; medium length, parted behind; eyes, black, and heavy dark eyebrows; wears a large seal ring on the little finger; when talking, inclines his head forward; looks down.

Description of the Person who Attempted to Assassinate Hon. W. H. Seward, Secretary of State. Height, 5 feet 10 inches; weight, 160 pounds; compact build; hair, jet black, thick, full and straight; no beard, nor appearance of beard; cheeks red on the jaws; face moderately full; 22 or 23 years of age; eyes, color not known; large, dark, not prominent; brows not known; dark, full, and large; nose, round; complexion healthy; nose straight; well formed, medium size; mouth small; lips thin; upper lip protruded when talked; chin sharp; ears prominent and of medium length; hands soft and small; fingers tapering; shows no signs of hard labor; broad shoulders; taper waist; straight legs; feet, not large; not gentlemanly but vulgar; overcoat double-breasted, color mixed of pink and gray spots, small; was a sack overcoat, pockets in side and back; pants black, common stout; new shoes; voice small and thin, inclined to tenor.

THE NATIONAL CALAMITY. Mourning Throughout the Country—Symptoms of the National Calamity—The Government—Movements of Booth Prior to the Assassination.
