PETITION OF THE COLORED PEOPLE OF ALEXANDRIA.—On Saturday last, a committee consisting of Rev. George W. Parker, Rev. Sampson White, and Messrs. R. H. Syles, R. W. Barks, appointed at a meeting of the colored people of Alexandria, to petition President Johnson and presented a petition asking that as the military rule in that city was about to be withdrawn, and the inhabitants to be restored to the full enjoyment of the protection of the Government might be extended to them (the colored people) against the operation of the unjust and oppressive laws which they have suffered previous to the occupation of the city by the U. S. military authorities.

The committee was cordially received by the President, who referred their petition to the War Department, and the same day, and that immediate action be taken on the same. On Monday they were informed that their request had been granted, so that the relations of the colored people to the national Government remain unchanged.
