OFFICIAL. By the President of the United States of America A PROCLAMATION. Whereas, by the Proclamations of the President of the nineteenth and twenty-seventh of April, eighteen hundred and sixty-one, a blockade of certain ports of the United States was set on foot; but, whereas, the reasons for that measure have ceased to exist:

Now, therefore, be it known that I, Andrew Johnson, President of the United States, do hereby declare and proclaim the blockade aforesaid to be terminated as to all the ports aforesaid, in that of the Potomac River and other ports west of the Mississippi river, which ports were to be open to foreign commerce on the first of July next, on the terms and conditions set forth in my Proclamation of the twenty-second of May last.

It is to be understood, however, that the blockade thus rescinded was an international measure for the purpose of protecting the sovereignty of the United States against the greater or less subversion of civil authority in the region to which it applied, and the impracticability of once restoring that civil authority, may, for a season, make it advisable to employ the army and navy of the United States towards carrying the laws into effect, wherever such employment may be necessary.

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS. FROM TEXAS. Important Official Intelligence—Flag of the Union Raised at Galveston, June 5. Terms of Surrender Signed in the Harbor. The Rebel Division of Tennessee, Officially Raised—Brownsville Occupied on the 1st Instant.

WAR DEPARTMENT. WASHINGTON, D. C., June 21, 1865. 3:40 P. M. Major General J. A. Dix, New York. The Navy Department has just received official despatches from Admiral Thatcher, dated at Galveston, June 5, reporting that on the first of this month the general commanding the United States forces, occupied and garrisoned Brownsville. On the 2d of June the rebel Generals Kirby Smith and Magruder, in the name of the Confederate General A. J. Smith representing Major General Canby, and General Kirby Smith then and there signed the terms of surrender previously agreed on at New Orleans.

FROM NASHVILLE. General Thomas Assume Command of the Department of the Tennessee—Appointment of Department General—Regulation of Trade, &c. NASHVILLE, June 21.—The following highly interesting order has just been issued: HON. MIL. DEPT. OF TENNESSEE, NASHVILLE, TENN., June 20, 1865.—General Orders, No. 1.—By order of the President of the United States, I hereby assume command of the Military Division of Tennessee, embracing the Department of Kentucky, Department of Alabama, and Department of Florida, with headquarters at Nashville. The Department of Kentucky is assigned to the command, with headquarters at Knoxville. The Department of Alabama is assigned to the command, with headquarters at Montgomery. The Department of Florida is assigned to the command, with headquarters at Tallahassee.

ANOTHER TERRIBLE ACCIDENT. Collision Between Railroad Trains—Fifteen Soldiers Killed and One Hundred and Fifty Wounded. LOUISVILLE, June 21.—The New Albany and Louisville Railroad accident occurred on the Ohio and Mississippi railroads near Logootree, Indiana, yesterday, a freight train bound east, and a soldier train bound west, having collided. The engineer and firemen on both trains were killed.
