Forty-first Congress.

Senate.—After our report closed the executive, legislative, and judicial appropriation bills were considered.

Mr. Merrill of Maine, moved an amendment providing that naval officers and surgeons of ports shall receive the same compensation which has heretofore been paid.

Mr. Williams moved an amendment increasing the salaries of the second comptroller and the commissioner of customs, the solicitor and register of the treasury, the auditors of the treasury, the commissioner of pensions, the commissioner of Indian affairs, and the commissioner of the general land office to \$4,000 annually, which was agreed to.

Mr. Deake moved an amendment appropriating \$5,000 for the salary of the solicitor and register of the treasury for the next fiscal year, which was agreed to.

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LATE TELEGRAMS, &c.

The Scheppe case came up yesterday in the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, at Harrisburg, on a writ to review the evidence taken during the trial of the prisoner at Carlisle, Pa., in accordance with the act of the Legislature on the subject.

The president of the Southern Pacific railroad has assured the workmen of San Francisco that if \$1,000,000 subsidy is voted to the company on the 7th of June, it shall all be executed among the workmen, meaning that the Chinese labor will be employed in the construction of the road.

A conflict is imminent between the public park commissioners and the superintendent of the new post office in New York, the former having determined to keep the latter from encroaching on the City Hall park, and the latter having determined to go on with his work.

A formidable rebellion has broken out in the province of Entre Rios, in the Argentine Confederation, from Australia, an attempt is being made to land a contingent of British troops.

The reports of a concentration of Fenians in Minnesota, received yesterday, seem to be to some extent confirmed. One of their first objects appears to be to place a force at Fort Williams to oppose the landing of the Canadian expedition.

News has been received at San Francisco from Japan of the arrival at Yokohama of Admiral Hornby from Australia, of an attempt to assassinate the American Consul at that place, (Yeddo), of frequent outrages on foreigners, &c.

In the House of Delegates of Virginia last evening, a warm debate took place over a proposition to strike the word "white" out of the tax law of that State.

The monitor Terror, now in Hampton Roads, will in a few days sail for the West India station. Quite a number of United States naval vessels are now in that station.

The Germans in New York celebrated the Baden Festival on 18th-19th yesterday. General Sigel and Schurz participated prominently.
