For almost an hour yesterday the coroner and jury summoned to hold an inquest over the remains of Mrs. Augusta V. Darling, who was killed Sunday by falling from an electric car on the Georgetown and Tenleytown road and mangled by the wheels, were occupied in hearing evidence.

After all the evidence was in the jury retired to the office of Undertaker Clement and after deliberating for some time they returned to the office of the coroner and announced that "the deceased came to her death on the evening of Sunday, September 25, 1902, from a fall from a car on the Georgetown and Tenleytown line."
