Awards Degrees to Twenty-Two Young Gentlemen - An Eloquent Address to the Graduates by Ex-Representative Butterworth - Those Who Won the Prizes.

Twenty-two gentlemen were raised to the dignity of lawyers last night at the Academy of Music. It was the annual commencement of the National University Law School, and the theater was crowded with a distinguished audience.

The full Marine Band under the personal direction of Prof. Fancull rendered its choicest music.

After the invocation by Rev. Dr. Samuel H. Green Judge MacArthur, ex-Representative Benjamin Butterworth, who was born on the program for an address to the graduates.

Mr. Butterworth said he had been retained to use the language of the craft - to give the graduates what they are least inclined to receive - advice. They would soon be fed-fledged lawyers, but a business card and a shingle were not sufficient to make a lawyer.

He cautioned them against despairing in the early stages of practice, and gave a humorous account of his tireless wait for his first client.

He was frequently asked whether it is well for the young lawyer to abstain from taking part in politics. His one answer had always been that it is imperative for a young lawyer to be a citizen without taking part in politics.

Economic, social and political questions of the present demanding solution and the young lawyers have important duties to perform. They should be sufficient to make them so will their honor be. Restless discontent, greed, appetite, avarice, anarchy, nihilism and communism have lately seen an invasion of our shores.
