SUGAR BOUNTY CASES. Judge McComas Holds That the Secretary's Act Was More Than Ministerial.

Writ of Mandamus Refused on the Grounds Set Forth in an Opinion Rendered Today. Judge McComas this morning rendered his decision in the case of the Miles Planting and Manufacturing Company of Louisiana against the Secretary of the Treasury and the commissioner of the internal revenue.

Repel of the Clause. The Secretary of the Treasury concluded that the paragraph is a repeal of the clause of the act of October 1, 1890, requiring the supervision and inspection of the production of sugar.

Not Merely Ministerial. The court further pointed out that the Secretary of the Treasury in this matter has exercised his judgment and discretion in expounding the revenue laws under which he is required to act.
