Some Handsome Details. A feature of the exterior of the edifice is the elaborate carving. About the finest bit of the sculptor's art has been placed in and around the north tower door.

Memorial Windows. One of the windows already in place is the one on the east end of the choir, in memory of his grandfather, Rev. H. Maskell L. Carl, one of the earliest ministers of the Church of New Jerusalem in this country.

The Interior Arrangement. Like the exterior of the edifice, the architecture of the interior is English Gothic. The choir is a handsome gallery, the pulpit is at the east end in twenty by twenty-four feet, and has a vaulted roof of buff brick with stone ribs.
