SWEEP BY FLAMES

Nearly Half a Million Dollars Loss in Philadelphia.

FIRE FOUGHT WITH GREAT DIFFICULTY

Narrow Escapes from Death at Grand Haven, Michigan.

INCENDIARIES AT WORK

PHILADELPHIA, February 17.—The big soap, lye and coffee essence manufactory of P. C. Thompson & Co., 553, 555 and 557 Otsego street, was totally destroyed by fire this morning. The dwelling houses Nos. 51, 53 and 55 Washington avenue adjoining Thompson's factory, were completely gutted, and the works of the Philadelphia Coppage Company badly damaged. The total loss will be about \$450,000. P. C. Thompson & Co.'s loss is about \$100,000; \$25,000 on the building, \$100,000 on stock and \$50,000 on the machinery. Thompson & Co.'s loss is nearly covered by insurances. The loss of the Philadelphia Coppage Company is \$25,000; partially insured. The dwelling houses adjoining Thompson's works and those directly opposite on Otsego street are damaged to the extent of \$10,000.

The fire originated in the main building of Thompson & Co., and was first seen by a man who lives at 31 Washington avenue. He went to the police station and turned in an alarm, but before the engines arrived the building was a mass of flames.

The firemen fought the fire under great difficulty, as the weather was extremely dry. The water was so hot that it boiled away from everything it touched. Three hundred barrels are thrown out of employment.

GRAND HAVEN, Mich., February 17.—The houses at the corner of the streets of Pearl and Ottawa streets, burned this morning. The losses will aggregate about \$2,000, partially insured. Among the occupants of the building are Grand Haven Fire Insurance Company, the Grand Rapids Democrat, United States and National Express Company's offices, and several families.

The fire started from an exploding lamp on the second floor, and was first seen by a man who lives at 31 Washington avenue. He went to the police station and turned in an alarm, but before the engines arrived the building was a mass of flames.

MARTINS FERRY, Ohio, February 17.—The factory of the Martins Ferry Glass Works, which was started up today with non-union hands. The fire was of incendiary origin, and the building was destroyed. The loss is about \$100,000. The building burned as if saturated with oil.

BOSTON, February 17.—By the exploding of a stove in the office of the New York and Boston Dispatch Express Company in the City Yard, New York, a fire broke out, a fire started which threatened to destroy the entire station and surrounding buildings. By great efforts on the part of the firemen, the flames were confined to the train sheds and express offices, and the fire was extinguished. The loss is about \$50,000. This is covered by insurance.

FRANCE'S GRAVE CRISIS

It is Practically a Struggle Between the Senate and the Deputies.

PARIS, February 17.—The political crisis which has arisen out of the demand of the senate for a vigorous and thorough inquiry into the Southern railroad scandal, that body having emphasized its attitude in the matter by twice refusing a vote of confidence in the cabinet. The chamber of deputies, it is asserted, has practically a struggle between the chamber of deputies, which has supported the radical ministry, and the senate, which seems bent upon overthrowing it, even at the cost of serious disturbances. However, in spite of the acute crisis and the possibility of the downfall of the bourgeois ministry or even a dissolution of parliament, there is little sincere sentiment outside of the newspaper offices.

But it is claimed that the resignation of the ministry would not alter matters to any great degree, as it appears to be no longer a question of the resignation of the cabinet, but of the resignation of the chamber of deputies. It is asserted, has practically, by defying the senate, endangered the constitution, and the result is a condition of affairs about as threatening as any since the troublesome times of 1870-71.

The newspapers are filled with excited articles and with political leaders, and many of them have expressed the opinion that a constitutional solution of the problem is impossible.

The conservatives and socialists demand a dissolution of parliament, and the moderate and republican press demand a dissolution of the senate. The chamber of deputies should take place under another cabinet.

CANT STOP MACCO.

Gomez's Lieutenant Crosses the Military Line.

HAVANA, February 17.—It is now reported that Macco, the insurgent leader, has succeeded in crossing the military line drawn across the island to prevent his escape from the province of Pinar del Rio, that he has passed between Neptune and Waterloo, on the south coast, and has entered the province of Havana.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., February 17.—A special train from Emporia, Kan., carrying Charles Christy of Waverly, Kan., a young lawyer, well known here, has just returned from Cuba, where he was a prisoner. He, with about 200 other Americans captured in one of the battles near Havana. All but he and fifteen other Americans were freed by the British. The American consul saved them. Christy is a member of one of the pioneer families of Coffey county, Ind. He claims the insurgents have everything on the island except Havana, and that will soon fall. He also says that since the new Spanish general has taken command no prisoners are killed.
