

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AN ART COMMISSION. The Bill as amended, passed by the Senate.

The Senate yesterday afternoon, on motion of Mr. Hansbrough, passed the bill, S. 1922, creating an art commission, after it had been amended in several particulars.

Mr. Hoar declared his belief that the great superiority of France in modern times in its monumental public works of art and architecture, both public and private, was due to the fact that they called into the service of the government the selection of those works eminent artists.

Mr. Hoar moved to strike out the clause excluding artists and sculptors, and the amendment was accepted. Mr. Hoar further moved to amend the bill so that the term of office of each commissioner should be for six years.
