THE BIG JULY GATHERING

Committee Satisfied With the Railroad Time Limit. Churches in Which Exercises Are to Be Held—The Mass Meetings in the Tents.

Considerable satisfaction is expressed in Christian Endeavor circles over the announcement of the determination of the railroad to amend a former action regarding the time limit of tickets to be sold for the July convention.

An extension has been granted, as announced in The Star, so that the tickets can be used for return passage up to the 31st of July, upon certain conditions.

About the 1st of February the railroad trunk line commission named the rates and conditions under which tickets will be sold at the time of the Christian Endeavor convention, which is to be held in this city from July 1 to 15.

At the time a special committee was appointed to secure the efforts of business men in order to induce the railroad to grant a more liberal time limit.

The committee of '96 is naturally gratified over the action of the railroad, while the conditions are not as liberal as have been granted at former Christian Endeavor conventions.
