EDUCATIONAL MATTERS.

Proceedings of District Board Meeting Held Last Evening. At last night's meeting of the board of education, a communication was read from Mr. J. H. Bradford, chaplain of Garfield Post, G. A. R., saying that he had been detailed by Department Commander I. W. Stone to have charge of "Flag day" exercises in the public schools, June 14, and requesting that members of the G. A. R. be authorized to visit the various schools on that occasion and participate in the exercises.

The list contains all the property in the city and county, including agricultural and non-agricultural lands on which taxes for the year ending June 30, 1900, were due and unpaid.

Holdsworth Gordon for reappointment as a member of the board of education. Mr. Gordon's term expires July 1 next, being the first to expire under the new law.
