Bulgarian government formally professes its horror at the crime and promises aid, but it is feared that if a government force is sent into the mountains the brigands will kill their captive, or in any case greatly distress her by their rapid flight through the ranges. She has, in fact, been heard from to plead that no such steps be taken, as she is already greatly distressed by the hardships of the chase. At this stage of the case the United States cannot easily charge the Bulgarian government with complicity in the affair, although the authorities at Sofia are under suspicion of having at least been indifferent to the matter.

Popular sympathy in England with the revolutionary committee and the abduction is generally applauded. Even if the United States were to assume the offensive and seek to demonstrate to Bulgaria that this deed is reprehensible in the sight of civilization, it could not reach that country's ports with a warship save through the Dardanelles, which are closed to such vessels by international agreement.
