Housing conditions, child life in neglected alleys, distressed families of Washington and the remedial work of the Associated Charities were discussed and portrayed with original stereoscopic views last night at the First Congregational Church.

An audience which completely filled the hall in one of the most spacious churches in town greeted the lecturer last night. They laughed heartily at occasional humorous stories and many tears of pathetic scenes of neglected child life and friendless people in need.
