

Evening Newspaper Printed Report That There Was a Shortage in His Accounts.

A dispatch from Louisville, Ky., last night says: After being offered an evening newspaper which said his books were under examination by expert accountants.

HOUSING LONDON'S POOR

THE COUNTY COUNCIL CLEARING AWAY SLUM DISTRICTS.

Two Hundred and Fifty Blocks of Workingmen's Dwellings Approached Completion.

From the London Express.

In a very short time the London common council will possess 250 blocks of workmen's dwellings, yielding a yearly rental of 1,600,000.

By the end of January next Gainsborough, in the July Seymour and Somerset buildings, in the Churchway, St. Pancras, will be finished for the accommodation of 472 persons.

Improvement in Clerkenwell.

The council's works department is now engaged in an exciting and important building site in Clerkenwell.

The greatest schemes are now being completed in the architect's office. The working drawings for the remainder of the dwellings to be put up on Reid's brewery site, and estimated to cost 274,865, have been practically completed.

White Hart Lane Scheme.

The biggest scheme of all is that known as the White Hart Lane, Tottenham, scheme, which, for buildings alone, will cost 1,300,000 to carry into effect.

A Japanese steamship was making the passage through the inland sea at the same time we were. She kept crowding us, and in spite of danger signals and all kinds of blasts took no notice, but


HAWAIIAN BOYS' PLUCK.
