

LAST PART OF DEBATE

Vote on Philippine Bill This Afternoon.

ITS PASSAGE CERTAIN

RECESS OF SENATE, AS NO ONE WAS READY TO SPEAK.

Conference Report on the River and Harbor Bill Adopted by the House After Some Discussion.

After a debate on the Philippine government bill continuing seven weeks the Senate late this afternoon will reach a final vote upon the measure. That the bill will be passed is beyond doubt.

NEED OF IMPROVING THE ANACOSTIA RIVER.

Representative Hepburn Declares That It Ought to Receive the Attention of Some Committee.

When the conference report on the river and harbor bill was submitted to the House today the attention of Chairman Burton was called to the item in the bill appropriating \$150,000 for the improvement of the Anacostia river.

Mr. Burton replied that it was the desire to limit the improvement of this river strictly along the lines of bettering navigation. He read from the report of the engineer that a 300-foot channel up to the navy yard, and a channel 400 feet wide in front of that yard, with a uniform depth of twenty feet, would be necessary.

PHILIPPINE BILL.
