LETTER TO NEW YORK CUSTOMS COLLECTOR.

MANIFEST INTENTION MUST NOT BE EXTENDED TO MERCHANDISE.

What Personal Effects Really Are—Discretion of the Officials to Be Exercised.

Secretary Shaw has sent to the collector of customs at New York the following explanation of the ruling of August 7 of the department as to the entry of personal and household effects:
