Labor day's observances vary with the locality and the general conditions affecting the working classes. Here in the District, where the relations between employer and employe are normally harmonious, and where differences are almost invariably adjusted on the basis of common sense and fair compromise, the holiday is not distinctly marked by any demonstration.
