COMPLAINT MADE OF DISCRIMINATION IN FAVOR OF CHURCHES. It is claimed that Hall Property is Injured Through Religious Edifices Being Rented.

George W. Evans, secretary of the board of directors of the National Rifles' army, has written to the Commissioners complaining that various churches in the city are renting their auditoriums for lectures and entertainments without paying a license for the privilege of such rentals.

Under the general law church property is exempt from taxation, conditionally that the same be absolutely devoted to religious purposes. Should they receive revenue from the sources mentioned then they should be placed in the same class as other places of amusement and taxed accordingly.
