OBJECT TO AMENDMENT. Commissioners' Report on Suggestion Regarding Assessment Bill.

The Commissioners in a report forwarded to Congress today, state that they do not consider advisable the adoption of the amendment proposed by Mr. Malcolm Hurty to Senate bill 2878, which bill provides for the levying of assessments against abutting property for the construction of water mains and sewers.

Mr. Hurty proposed to add a proviso to section 7 of the proposed bill, which provides that the District assessor is authorized and directed "in cases where water main assessments or assessments for sewerage sewers may be quashed, canceled, set aside, or declared void by the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, or may otherwise be canceled or set aside, by reason of an imperfect or erroneous description of the lot or parcel of ground against which the same have been levied, by reason of such tax or assessment not having been authenticated by the proper officer or by reason of a defective return of service of notice, or for any technical reason other than the right of the authorities of the District of Columbia to levy assessment or for the recording in the office of the assessor of a defective return of service of notice, which assessment was levied, to re-levy such assessment at the rate and in the manner provided in this act." Provided, That such reassessment shall be made within sixty days from date of such cancellation.
