TOTAL SLOCUM DEAD 883

INQUEST SHOWED LIFE PRESERVERS WERE DATED 1895.

Evidence Was Multiplied That Steamer Was Not Adequately Equipped for Fighting Fire.

Bodies recovered... 833 Identified dead... 778 Missing... 200 Apparent total dead... (833)

A dispatch from New York last night says that a complete list of those who were on the ill-fated excursion steamer North Brother Island, the bodies of its victims continue to be found in the waters adjacent to the scene of the disaster.

Today thirty-seven came to the surface, making the total number recovered 883. Of these 778 have been identified. Despite the fact that the police are bending every energy toward getting a complete list of the figures on the ill-fated excursion, definite figures as to the number missing cannot be given.

From present indications, however, it is apparent that the death toll will total nearly 1,000.

Loss May Reach 1,086.

Revised lists of the missing make it probable that the number will be about 3,000—it was 308 last night. Adding this to the dead already identified, the total is reached 1,086. Although it is believed, will not be far from the exact number.

Which can, of course, never be known. Tomorrow 100 policemen who speak German will begin a house-to-house canvass for the purpose of verifying the list of the missing.

Life Preservers Rusted by Wire.

At yesterday's session of the coroner's inquest it was admitted by the officers of the Knickerbocker Steamboat Company that no new life preservers were placed on board the Slocum since 1895.

The engineer testified that he never knew of a fire drill aboard her, and other witnesses told of the inflammable character of the contents of the cabin where the fire started.

Another member of the Slocum's crew expressed the opinion that wires placed to hold the life preservers in position had rotted them.

The bodies of fifty-two unidentified dead were prepared for burial yesterday. Their interment will take place today in the Lutheran cemetery at Middle Village, L. I.

Cheap Fire Hose.

Evidence was multiplied that the General Slocum was not equipped in any way for fighting a fire. Cheap new fire hose had been provided this year, but it has not been tested in any way, either by the inspectors or the officers of the boat.

When the emergency arose the hose could not be used; it was kinked and twisted, and the coupling to the nozzle was so tight that the nozzle could not be attached.

According to the testimony of the mate, this hose was not 100 feet long, as the mate of the Knickerbocker fleet, the commodore of the fleet, Mr. Schickel, who commanded the Slocum, and who is now confined in the Lemanon Hospital, and Capt. Edward Van Wart, the chief pilot.

A THOROUGH CANVASS

OFFICIALS SEEKING NAMES OF SLOCUM PASSENGERS.

Only One Body Recovered Last Night—Capt. Van Schack in Court on a Stretcher.

NEW YORK, June 23.—The canvass to determine as nearly as possible the exact number of persons that were on the General Slocum disaster will be even more thorough than at first intended.

Not only will every home in the great city which is thought to have been directly affected by the disaster be visited by the special detail of patrolmen, but the investigation will be extended to other cities and towns as well.

From various points along Long Island and the Jersey shore in the state of Pennsylvania have come reports that persons believed to have gone on the ill-fated excursion are missing.

Where it is possible these places will be visited by the New York investigators, but in many cases the local police will be, or already have been, requested to assist in the work.

It is estimated that even more will be required to complete the canvass and compile the final list of dead, missing and saved.

Last night's searching for bodies of victims was more barren of results and less eventful than has been the case during any of the other days of the inquest.

The alertness and vigil of the searchers was unrelaxed, but only one body was taken from the river during the night.

When the inquest was resumed today, Policeman James Collins said he was at College Point and 134th street, when he saw the body of a man who was taken in a stretcher and carried to the morgue.

He thought the man was the fire department, and with another policeman, Farrell, he got a yawl and rowed over to North Brother Island, where the Slocum was then beached.
