If possible the National Guard of the nation's capital is going to win the trophy and the rule has been to proceed in conformity with the end in view. District riflemen further down the list.

DISTRICT RIFLEMEN

Its Detachment Won No Laurels in Yesterday's Trials.

VICTORIOUS TODAY. COMPETITION FOR THE LEECH CUP OCCURS THIS AFTERNOON.

All Eyes Centered on Dryden Trophy—Story of Its Donation—Comment on Manassas Meet.

Special From a Staff Correspondent. RIFLE RANGE, Sea Girt, N. J., September 7.—The District of Columbia moved to the front today by capturing the Washington riflemen not only took first place, but also third prize and possibly second prize. The winning team was that representing Company I, 2d Regiment, its score being 310 out of a possible 350. The team of Company I, 1st Regiment, finished third, with a total of 308. The United States Marine Corps second team scored 309, but the District has protested its score.

Immediately after the firing began Maj. Harvey, captain of the District's brigade rifle team, notified the proper official that he would enter a protest against the Marine Corps.

Major Harvey contends that the Marine Corps is not organized as a company, and therefore should not have been permitted to compete in a company team match. Further, he maintains that it is clearly in violation of the regulations of the National Rifle Association of America, which provide that a company team from a membership of more than 4,000 men and have it shoot against teams representing companies of only about 40 men each. The protest will be vigorously pushed. Should it be sustained the team of Company I, 1st Regiment, D. C., will be entitled to second prize. The winning team, Company I, 2d Regiment, D. C., will receive \$75 and a gold medal for each team member. The third prize is \$25 and a silver medal for each member and third prize is \$25 with a bronze medal for each member.

The Regimental Team Match.

The 1st New Jersey, which won the regimental team match a year ago, also finished in the lead in the company team match. The District of Columbia did not earn any laurels, the best its detachment could do being to finish fifth and sixth out of a field of eleven contestants. However, the members of the District's regimental teams secured good practice for the Dryden match. The scores in the regimental team match follow:
