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Count Wants Only Former Income. The financial negotiations in the Castellane case at Paris do not relate to Count Boni's allowance after separation from his wife, formerly Anna Gould of New York, but he does not expect a large amount. The count's announcement was made to one of the lawyers of the countess. It was most emphatic and is substantially in the following terms: "I declare on oath and I swear to the exactness of my declaration, that I not only do not demand, but that I will not accept any sum beyond that small amount which constituted my income before my marriage." The count thus disposes of the statement to the effect that he contemptuously refused the countess to consider only his outstanding indebtedness, which reaches a substantial sum.

Inspection of Motor Boats. To the Editor of The Star: It is reported that the bill introduced in Congress for the inspection and licensing of motor boats will probably receive favorable consideration. In view of this I have written the Senate committee on commerce as follows: "In view of the fact that there is not a particle of danger in the operation of a motor boat, if only ordinary precautions are taken in regard to the supply tank, the inspection and licensing proposed would seem to be unreasonable and unjustified. It is, however, the licensing should become law, it is to be hoped that the same individual pleasure launches will be distinguished from the higher powered craft used for trading and racing purposes, in fixing the inspection fees. If the fees are not reasonably low, it will be a hardship for thousands of owners of small pleasure craft to meet the extra additional and wholly unnecessary expenses."

Must Explain Accident. A street car and automobile collided at the intersection of Connecticut avenue and M street this morning about 10:45 o'clock and both vehicles were damaged. The automobile is the property of the United States Express Company and was operated by Harry B. Pope. Michael Behm was the motorist. The car at the time the accident occurred. A number of passengers were in the car at the time, but none of them was injured. The police of the third precinct notified the motorist and chauffeur to appear in the Police Court tomorrow morning and explain the accident.

Punished for Assault. When Walter Carter returned to his home at 2221 Pomeroy court northwest yesterday morning he found his wife ironing, and proceeded to chastise her with one of the flatirons. He was arrested by Policeman Walsh of the eighth precinct about an hour later for the assault and was arraigned in the Police Court this morning. Carter will spend four months in jail.
