Weather conditions and general forecast: High pressure and generally fair weather with seasonable temperatures prevail this morning over all districts east of the Rocky mountains, except in the extreme northwest, where temperatures are rather low.

West of the Rocky mountains the weather has been unsettled with rain and rain showers over the southern districts, due to low pressure over Arizona and Southern California.

The weather will be partly cloudy tonight and Saturday in the east and south, with showers in the east gulf states.

Storms along the middle Atlantic coast will be light to fresh west to east; on the south Atlantic coast light to fresh north to northeast; on the east gulf coast light to fresh northeast to east, and on the lower lakes fresh westerly.

Steamers departing today for European ports will have fresh westward winds and generally fair weather to the Grand Banks.

GOLD IN SALT BAG.

Woman Discovers the Hiding Place of Father's Treasure.

Fifteen thousand dollars in gold in a salt bag, flattened between two pieces of cardboard, was the discovery made recently by Mrs. Mary R. Kuser of this city, says a Philadelphia dispatch, while arranging the household goods at the home of her late father in Detroit, Mich., for sale.

Mrs. Kuser's father, John Miller, died on September 9. Mrs. Kuser went to Detroit several weeks ago to dispose of his estate, which is valued at \$150,000. Several days ago, so relatives were informed in this city, Mrs. Kuser got the household goods ready for sale. While taking up the carpet from the bedroom on the second floor, Mrs. Kuser opened it and there rolled out a glittering pile of coins. When they were counted, they totaled \$15,000.

Mrs. Mullin lived in an old mansion on the heart of Detroit. His hobby was collecting curios. It was also said he was accustomed to hide money in all parts of the house. The news of the discovery brought hundreds of persons to the sale, and all kinds of furniture were bought at high prices, with the hope that hidden money might be found in them.
