MAY BE MURDER.

Woman Found Dead Under Suspicious Circumstances.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., December 18.—According to the report of the coroner Mrs. Julia Post, an aged reclus, who resided at 1028 Main street, Sharpburg, an Allegheny suburb, was murdered. She was found dead in her home yesterday, and it was thought she met with an accident, but the discovery of a wound on her head and a bloodstained hatchet leads to the supposition that her death was due to a blow inflicted with that instrument. Mrs. Post, who was seventy-eight years old, lived alone, and it is said the

report was current that she expected a remittance from a son living in California. It is supposed that robbers, gaining knowledge of this, entered the house to get this money and that the aged woman met her death upon refusing to make known its whereabouts.
