**SUES TO ENJOIN SALE**

**Major George A. Armes' Proceedings Against Mrs. Armes and Others.**

Suit to enjoin the sale of Fairfield, on Connecticut avenue extended, has been filed in the District Supreme Court by Maj. George A. Armes against his wife, Mrs. Mary Wine Armes, Charles A. Douglas, her agent; E. B. Sherrill, holder of a \$5,000 note secured on the property, and Tallmadge A. Lambert, trustee under the deed of trust for default under which the property is advertised for sale.

Major Armes tells the court that he executed the note in question and gave the deed of trust in May 1886, but that February 14, 1905, he married his wife, who is named as defendant, and conveyed to her the property in consideration of an alleged agreement to take care and pay the note.

In May, 1907, it is alleged, Mrs. Armes purchased the note and without notice to her husband authorized the trustee to advertise the property.

The court is asked to stop the sale and cancel the note.

Attorneys Halston & Siddons appeared for Major Armes.

**FISH AND GAME.**

**Meeting of Local Association Held Last Night.**

A meeting of the Game and Fish Protective Association was held last evening at the office of Dr. Walter S. Harban, 1339 K street northwest, at which Dr. Harban, president of the association, presided. The most important business before the association was relative to the revising of the District game laws as to quail and water fowls. Maj. Richard Sylvester and Dr. T. S. Parker were appointed as a committee to look up the matter.

It was decided by the association to secure more funds for the purpose of purchasing birds to be placed in Rock Creek Park. This association has done considerable work along this line and has already placed several pairs of Canadian ducks, swans and other varieties of fowls in the park.
