Relief Committee of Hattiesburg, Miss., Sends Acknowledgments. From the central relief committee of Hattiesburg, Miss., through D. L. Bennett, its secretary, Secretary Metcalf has received a letter extending to him and through him to the President sincere thanks for the part taken by the Navy Department in sending aid to the storm sufferers in Mississippi. The first representatives of the government to reach that section were Surgeon N. T. McLean and Dr. Hemesch of the navy. High appreciation is expressed of the waiver of departmental formalities to the extent of sending capable persons to render prompt and valuable aid.
