Small Declines and Advances Mark the Week-End.

W. U. T. Stock and Erie Issues the Features. STEEL STOCKS ARE STRONGER. Slight Check to Retail Trade Charged to Weather—Crop Prospects of Reassuring Character.

NEW YORK, May 1.—Security prices today in the greater number of stocks did little more than mark time, and closed at small and miscellaneous scattered declines and advances.

Attention was more attracted to the strength of the Erie and issues than to the rise in the Erie stocks and the current enlargement of the Erie's earnings.

The steel stocks, too, were stronger than they were yesterday, possibly because of the news of another and second advance in the price of Birmingham pig iron.
