

HARRIMAN'S WEALTH
Appraised Estimate Estate Is Worth \$149,000,000.
STATE'S SHARE \$1,490,000
Inheritance Tax of One Per Cent Levied Against It.

HOLDINGS ALL LEFT TO WIFE
Some Other Millions May Have Been Divided Among Children Prior to Death.

NEW YORK, December 1.—Edward H. Harriman, when he died, was worth \$149,000,000. This became known yesterday when the appraisers appointed by the surrogate's court completed their estimate of his holdings. Before the railroad wizard's death, and shortly after it, all sorts of estimates were made about his fortune, ranging from \$50,000,000 to \$250,000,000. But there were no means of telling even approximately how much wealth the mysterious little man had accumulated. The \$149,000,000 is rather more than most guessers at Harriman's riches thought he had. The general estimate of his estate was \$100,000,000.

One Per Cent for State.
The state of New York, under the inheritance tax, will receive from Harriman's estate the comfortable sum of \$1,490,000, which it collects 1 per cent of the total where the estate is left to one person.

That will be the case with Harriman's hundred and a half millions. He bequeathed everything of which he was possessed to his wife, Mary Averell Harriman, whom he married in Rochester when he was merely a small trader in Wall street.

Harriman's fortune may have been more than \$149,000,000, now discovered, however. It was said about the time of his death that he had distributed a large part of it—large in ordinary terms of money, though not large when compared with his total wealth—to his children. This, though, was not confirmed. It may be that the present estimate represents his total amassment during his wonderful career.

Since the railroad wizard's death his widow has, as he desired, been active in co-operating with his business associates in administering the vast interests which he left up.

The associates say that she is a wonderful woman, and has displayed remarkable knowledge of her husband's methods and ambitions, and of railroad business in general.

Things Could Be Done With \$149,000,000 of Money

It is generally conceded, even by the most conservative residents of the District of Columbia, where the only living Ultima Thule of this species is now in captivity, that \$149,000,000 is some money. While Washington bankers—like Charles J. Clark, who has just died—previously denoting a depositor with a bag of iron men—cautiously admit the possibility of this much government kale being collected in one bundle, yet to the average man who skates merrily through life on bending and cracking financial ice, who feels happy and content with an annual \$113 on the right side and he can pay the wash lady on Saturday night, the great sum left by Harriman doesn't mean anything.

It amounts simply to a figure of speech, a fanciful outburst, a post-mortem jest by the greatest of the great. It is a figure which the world might just as well have read, "I hereby devise and bequeath all the money what there is, and the effect on the non-wash lady is the same.

Enough to Run District Forever.
Just suppose Harriman hadn't a family to remember in his will. Suppose he had said to himself: "Why, these are the District of Columbia. Congress doesn't treat the District right, and I think I'll make it independent. I'll just endow it."

Suppose he had said that? He could have done it. That's one of the things one hundred and forty-nine million will do. He could have tied up the principal of his fortune, the interest going to the District. And on the earning capacity of the securities left by him the District would be able to pay its current indebtedness, provide for permanent improvements and get along better than it does at present with Congress paying half the bills.

Suppose Harriman wanted to leave as a monument to himself a structure as great and which would cost as much as the United States Capitol has cost since the corner stone was laid. He could have built not only one, but in a dozen.

Suppose he preferred to erect a structure as beautiful and as costly as the Congressional Library. He could have put in twenty.

Suppose he had wanted to establish a pension fund. If, again, he had tied up his principal, the earning power of the securities left by him would make available for the purpose between five and twenty million dollars a year.

The average salary here in Washington is about one thousand dollars a year, which is considerably higher than the average for the country. The income on the Harriman estate would pay about fifteen thousand such salaries every year. In other words, would remunerate about half the annual wage of the force of government employes in the National Capitol.

Suppose Harriman's money was all in dollar bills, the kind of bills most folks see when they see any at all, the common or garden variety of one hundred. And suppose those bills were put end to end. They'd reach just 18,225 miles, or two-thirds of the way around the world. And as a top to the thirty, it might be mentioned that the principal of the Harriman fortune would buy 3,800,000,000 glasses of beer, or 1,192,000,000 real drinks.
