ARMY AND NAVY Resignation of a Chaplain. Chaplain John Rivera of the Porto Rico Regiment of Infantry has resigned, to take effect August 21, and his resignation has been accepted by the President. Chaplain Rivera is a native of Porto Rico and was appointed chaplain of the Porto Rican Infantry in May, 1909.
