

SMART MODELS for

THE summer season which is just now opening is so replete with opportunity for the making of pretty costumes that we may safely look for charming and attractive pictures wherever we turn. White is a pronounced favorite and is to be worn both upon the street and within doors. Gowns and suits of taffeta are exceedingly smart.

Foulard is one of the stand-bys and the foulards of this season are as pretty as can be. For indoor wear and for the picturesque gowns that are so much liked, what is known as Jouy designs are much used. These are simply pretty, flowered patterns over a light ground.

They are especially pretty in combination with plain taffeta, and very attractive gowns are made from the two materials. But while silks are to be much worn, nothing ever really supersedes lingerie materials and linen for really warm weather.

Bordered effects are in demand and a great many of the overskirts and tunics are made with straight edges, which allow of using these materials to bring about ideal results. In one of the illustrations is shown a young girl's dress with an apron overskirt of this kind, and such effects are among the smartest.

Fichus, too, are important. They are always pretty and becoming, but they are especially desirable just now for the reason that they harmonize to a nicety with the materials in vogue.

Both gowns and coats are worn with big collars, and these collars, made of batiste or organdie, embroidered in the punched work style, are new and dainty and give a very smart finish to an otherwise simple toilet.

For the little folks' dresses will be used fine lawns, embroidered muslins and all similar fabrics, but they also are wearing a great deal of the cotton voile, which is at once dressy in effect and durable.

For the sturdy dresses, adapted to playtime and the happy summer holidays, linen in combined colors is excellent, and plain linen of dark tone is made at once durable and pretty by a finish of some simple embroidered edge. Belts always make a feature of the little girls' long-waisted dresses and a great many of patent leather are worn. The bright red ones are pretty and childish in effect and are used whenever they suit the color of the frock.

For the daintier frocks embroidered muslins are always charming, and the familiar lawns and batistes are much used, so that together with the voiles and marisettes there is a very wide range of choice.

Patterns seventy-one-ninety-four and seventy-three-fifty-seven are cut in sizes from thirty-four to forty-two inches bust, seventy-one-eighty-eight from thirty-four to forty-four inches bust, seventy-four-forty-five and seventy-three-seventeen from twenty-two to thirty-two waist. Patterns seventy-four-forty-one and seventy-four-twenty-eight are cut in sizes for sixteen and eighteen years, seventy-two-twenty-nine from eight to twelve years, seventy-four-forty-three from six to ten and seventy-four-forty from two to six years.



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
