News of Lighthouse Service.
Lightship No. 89, from the Cape Lookout station on the North Carolina coast, which was relieved by lightship No. 78 last week, has arrived at Baltimore from Portsmouth, Va., to receive a general overhauling before returning to her station. The work on the ship, it is stated, will require a month or six weeks to complete, and she is to be put in trim to withstand the heavy winter storms that often sweep over her station.
Spent much of the summer at the Hunting Creek flats below Alexandria, is reported fifth district of position and a notice regarding the vessel was issued from the office of Inspector Rutland, as follows:
"Virginia-Hampton" was relieved by the new lightship No. 89, which was reported out of position September 12, and Newport News upper channel buoy No. 12, which was reported missing September 12, were replaced same date.
"Maryland-Potomac" river: Hunting Creek flats below Alexandria, was reported dragged northward about three-quarters of a mile from its correct position September 12 and will be replaced as soon as practicable.
Chesapeake bay—Main channel to Baltimore: Craiglight channel buoy No. 14, which was reported missing September 14, will be replaced as soon as practicable.
