ALEXANDRIA AFFAIRS

Moving Picture Manager Appeals From Justice Decision. WILL TEST BAN ON VIEWS Retail Merchants Urge Erection of High School Building—Woman Social Workers to Meet.

ALEXANDRIA, Va., April 16, 1913. First case of violation of the city ordinance making it a misdemeanor to show crime pictures in the "movies" came up in the police court today, when B. B. Smith, manager of the Alexandria Surprise Amusement Company, was cited for showing two alleged crime pictures. One depicted a duel scene during the running of a reel portraying the battle of Shiloh, and the other, it was claimed, was entitled "God's Unfortunate," and showed a scene followed by a supposed killing. The story, according to the testimony, was interwoven with a love scene in which the principals were a city and a country man. B. B. Smith, manager of the establishment, said he did not follow the pictures very closely, but his opinion the shows were very "tame." Justice Catton said that he did not think it necessary to have the pictures taken him as evidence, and added that the ordinance is not intended to interfere with pictures along educational lines, but is intended for just the opposite. Plain killings, he said, are just the opposite to educational lines, and would come under the ban. He, therefore, imposed the minimum fine of \$5. Mr. Smith noted an appeal.

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RECREATION DEPARTMENT IN DISTRICT IS DESIRED

Minnesota Avenue Improvement Association Indorses Bill Before Congress. The Minnesota Avenue Improvement Association is to take an active interest in the movement to establish a department of recreation in the District government, and is to use its efforts to have Congress pass the bill now before it creating such a department. This was determined at the April meeting of the association last evening at the home of J. T. Herbert on Good Hope road southeast. A. C. Moses president of the Washington Playground Association, presented the matter by letter, and requested the appointment of a representative to confer on the subject. Rev. George M. Cummings was selected. Mention was also made of the fact that while the parents of the school children in Anacostia were called upon once a year to contribute toward the maintenance of the playgrounds, it seemed that all of the money was spent in improving the city grounds and nothing expended in Anacostia. Plans for holding a public demonstration of the new pumping station, being erected at 18th street and Minnesota avenue, upon its completion, took definite form last evening, and President J. T. Herbert, chairman of the special committee, announced the members of that committee as follows: Dr. J. T. Herbert, Rev. George M. Cummings, William Scantlebury, Jr., J. T. Herbert and W. W. Tolson. The wives of the committee members will be asked to assist the committee in arranging this affair. From present indications the station will be completed by the middle of next month. A meeting of the committee is to be held at the home of Dr. J. T. Herbert on Minnesota avenue the evening of Friday, April 25, for the purpose of completing arrangements. The opening of 18th Street from Minnesota avenue to Good Hope road is to be urged upon the Commissioners for early attention, as it is believed that this thoroughfare should be placed in use at this time. It is the desire that one or more trunk sewers be laid running from Minnesota avenue to the river, between Good Hope road and 18th street, in order to permit of the carrying off of the rainfall. J. T. Herbert, chairman of the committee on sewers, reported that progress was being made toward the laying of this trunk sewer on Minnesota avenue from 18th street to Naylor road.
