

WASHINGTON ROWERS SHATTER A RECORD

Pacific Coast Crew Hangs Up New Figures in Two-Mile Time Trial.

POUGHKEEPSIE, N. Y., June 18.—At least one record was smashed during the time trials of the crews over the Poughkeepsie course late yesterday afternoon, when Coach Conbeer's Washington Varsity four-oared crew rowed the two miles in 35.25 seconds, faster than the four-oared record of 10:01, made by Cornell July 2, 1908.

Will, the boat, who does the guiding perfect course, and Stroke Hutton hit up a merry pace right from the start. The coach urged the brawny quartet at every ten strokes, and the first mile was covered in 4:55. When the crew struck the last quarter Hutton raised the stroke, and the crew finished like a whirlwind.

Coach Courtney of Cornell was on his float when the crew came down, and caught the last mile after which he reminded his four-oared crew that it would have to "step some" to get away from the Pace a coach four.

Conbeer also sent his varsity eight-oared crew over the course last night in almost slack water with a stiff breeze, but no time was announced.

Cornell's crew had a six-mile row, while Columbia again went up the river for a long pull. Coach Rice put his men through starts and sprints.

Coach Vail sent his crews over the course at 10:00. The varsity eight-oared crew started at the head of the course, and picked up the freshmen at the two-mile mark. The men and the boatmen, the seniors getting the better of the contest. Although no times were given out the coach appeared satisfied with the trial.
