DECLARES ITS POWERS NOT ABRIDGED AT ALL

Representative Covington Explains Interstate Trade Commission Bill.

The bill creating the interstate trade commission gives to the commission ample powers of independent initiative, according to Representative Covington.

Mr. Covington states that an analysis of the bill would show the contrary. He said: "The independent initiative of the commission is preserved in every part of the bill except the single section in which the commission is made the investigating agent of the President."

Mr. Covington also made it clear that the section of the bill providing for punishment of persons unlawfully making public information of the commission is not intended in any manner to curb the power of newspapers to disclose in any way they please information coming into their possession.

The bill is the first of the so-called administration anti-trust and commerce regulation measures to go to the House.
