Model No. 227—illustrated—is a "classic," designed for a somewhat developed figure. Extremely long hip and back. Medium bust. This corset is boned sufficiently to give necessary support. Back is boned to give the desired smooth, flat effect.

Models No. 332 and 119—illustrated—are ideal styles for slender and medium figures, very low bust, extremely long down. This garment gives the fashionable unconfined waist effect and the altogether modish silhouette. The long cloth extension affords a graceful, sweeping hip. A

special feature of elastic gores, inserted in front at top, allows freedom through the diaphragm. The corset is lightly but adequately boned throughout, boning being so placed as to avoid rubbing the hip bone.

Model No. 239—illustrated—a corset with an extremely low bust. This garment is sparingly boned, but is long, holding the figure sufficiently. Back is high enough to take care of flesh through the shoulders, and is boned well toward the bottom of the corset to give the desired flat effect. It has the special feature of no stays over the hip bone, thus conforming to comfort, but not at all lacking in necessary confinement. Ideal garment for the average figure, requiring a light-weight corset, producing the modish silhouette.

Model No. 131—illustrated—designed for slender and medium figures, desiring the medium bust effect, combined with long hip. The garment is lightly boned throughout, the skirt extension, coming well down below the termination of the boning, holding the figure snugly and trimly. The corset is practical and durable.
