NURSE CRIES THE NEED OF HOSPITAL SUPPLIES

Pathetic Appeal Made in Behalf of 42,000 Wounded Men in Distress.

The Star will receive, acknowledge and transmit to the American Red Cross contributions from the public toward the work to be undertaken by that organization in connection with the war abroad.

"We have 42,000 wounded in this little corner of Brittany alone," wrote a nurse at Val Fleuri in a letter received yesterday by Miss Mabel Boardman, chairman of the relief committee of the American Red Cross.

Five Thousand in Small Area. "We have now within the radius of five miles over 5,000 wounded. In Dinard we have turned all of the large hotels and casinos into hospitals—ten in all, with about 3,000 beds. At St. Lunair, a suburb, there are four hospitals, with 600 beds. At St. Malo and other places there are five other hospitals, with between 1,200 and 1,500 beds. Our only means of procuring supplies for our hospitals is by the sea. WEATHER.

Fair and Slightly Warmer Today; Monday Fair.

For the District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia, fair, slightly warmer today, Monday fair; gentle to moderate south winds.

Another disturbance is approaching the north Pacific coast, and rains are falling in Washington. Over the remainder of the country the weather was fair during the last twenty-four hours, except in southern New Mexico and eastern Maine, where there were light rains. The Canadian river, west disturbance has reached the upper lake region and pressure has fallen generally east of the Missouri river, except in New England, but without further result than unseasonably high temperatures in the upper lake region, the upper Mississippi, and Missouri valleys and the plains states. Over the eastern, southern and extreme western portions of the country temperature changes were not of consequence.

The winds along the north and middle Atlantic coasts will be moderate, mostly southwest; on the Atlantic coast moderate east and southeast; on the east gulf coast gentle to moderate east and south; on the west gulf coast moderate southeast; on the upper fresh south and southwest today with fair weather, except possibly showers on Superior, on the northern upper lake region, and Missouri and southwest today with fair weather.
