FIGHT AT SOISSONS ANTIENTAM'S EQUAL

But Bitter Struggle Passes Merely as Incident in Present Great War. BATTLE FOR EIGHT DAYS; VICTORY TO THE GERMANS French Driven From Heights of the Aisne, Leaving Field Strewn With Their Dead.

BEFORE SOISSONS, January 18, by courier to Berlin, January 20, via London, January 21.—At the headquarters of a certain German army yesterday evening Gen. von Kluck and his staff celebrated the battle and their success at Soissons in typical German military fashion with a simple soldiers' meal, a bowl of punch, brewed by the expert hands of von Kluck himself; a graceful little speech by the general and a silent toast to the dead—both French and German.

Dead Still Littered Field. Most of the German dead have been given to the earth, but French infantrymen in their fall—be-seen—of the uniforms, swarthy-faced Turcos, colonials, Alpine riflemen and bearded territorials still are sprawling in attitudes along the heights, in the deep-cut gorges of the plateau and across the flat valley bed on the north shore of the Aisne.

French Began the Battle. A high, level plateau rises steeply a couple of hundred feet from the valley of the Aisne and from this side of the valley forms the center and eastern flank of the battlefield. The plateau is deeply notched by three steep-sided ravines running down to the Aisne and through which the French were able to bring up supports unnoticed and without danger to positions on the plateau.

Threatened With Loss of Licenses. Failure to pay the special tax imposed by the war emergency revenue act will result in revocation of licenses of customhouse brokers. RESOLUTION PROPOSES "TAG" FOR CONGRESSMEN

Representative Cary Introduces Protective Measure Against "Fake" National Legislators. Saturday night rioters, poolroom prisoners and others who are arrested and pass themselves out of the station house to liberty by claiming they are Congressmen will run the risk of severe punishment if the resolution of Representative Cary of Wisconsin is adopted. Mr. Cary is highly indignant because of the rumors that two of the men arrested in the raid on the Parliament Rod and Gun Club at Myers Station, Md., claimed to be members of Congress and were allowed their liberty.

"Drunk" Victimizes Policemen. Mr. Cary's indignation is heightened further by learning that recently a highly intoxicated person was allowed to go free from one of the police stations in this city by assuming a dignified attitude and announcing that he was Congressman Cary, from Milwaukee. The policemen, it is claimed, allowed this man to go free, and later learned that they had been victimized.

ENCAMPMENT PLANS ARE TO BE CONSIDERED
