

LENTEN SERVICES IN CITY CHURCHES

Dominican Order Ceremonies in the Early Morning of Ash Wednesday.

PROGRAM IS ARRANGED FOR ALL OF THE MASSES

Order of Observance at St. Alban's and in Other Protestant Episcopal Parishes.

In connection with the plans for Lent in the various churches of the District, both Catholic and Protestant, the Dominican Order has arranged to surround the opening of the season with all possible solemnity.

Holy communion at 7:30 o'clock is to inaugurate Lent Ash Wednesday morning in St. Alban's Protestant Episcopal parish. Services at Bethlehem Chapel by Canon De Vries will begin at 7:30 o'clock Wednesday morning, with holy communion and the other offices of prayer.

Services in the Chapels.

Holy communion will be celebrated Ash Wednesday in St. Columba's chapel at 9 a. m. and evening prayer, with address, will be at 7 in the evening. One service only is scheduled for St. David's Chapel, at 7:30, in St. Patrick's chapel the single service will be at 8 o'clock.

At Stephen's Episcopal Church.

Rev. George F. Dudley, rector of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, Columbia Heights, has planned a number of observances during Lent for his parishioners.

Beginning Ash Wednesday holy communion will be celebrated, and a fifteen-minute sermon delivered at 7 and 9 o'clock every morning. Every afternoon except Saturday special services will be held at 5 o'clock. Mr. Dudley will officiate every afternoon at 5 o'clock on Mondays and Tuesdays, when Mr. Riker will have charge of the services.

Programs Elsewhere.

Rev. Herbert Scott Smith, rector of St. Margaret's Episcopal Church, will begin Thursday a series of special services which he has intended primarily for men, will be open to both sexes. The hour is 4:45 p. m.

Masses at St. Teresa's Church.

Masses at 6:30 and 8 a. m. Ash Wednesday are to inaugurate the Lenten observance at St. Teresa's Catholic Church, Anacostia, the services being conducted by Rev. Charles M. Bart, who also will conduct the stations of the cross every Friday afternoon and evening during Lent.

ART IN THE NATIONAL CAPITOL.

Since the outbreak of the European war art lovers have turned their attention to the works of art in this country, and among the many wonderful collections open to them one which is receiving at this time somewhat tardy recognition is the galaxy of paintings and busts in the halls of the National Capitol.

Although this wonderful collection cannot boast of priceless foreign masterpieces, it has many portraits, paintings and sculptures that are of great value from a historical, as well as from an artistic viewpoint.

Other Paintings of Great Value.

Some of the most important of these paintings are of such wonderful historical importance that they, too, are priceless. The "Embarkation of the Pilgrims," by Robert W. Weir, "Discovery of the Mississippi," by Winslow Powell, and the "Baptism of Pocahontas," by John C. Chapman, are all wonderful works of art, and yet Congress paid but \$12,000 for each.

Above these oil paintings, running all around the interior of the rotunda, are the historical frieze, the circular frieze, the frieze of the Capitol, and the frieze of the Lincoln Memorial. The frieze was then taken up by Filippo Costaglini, likewise a native of Rome, who also died before it could be completed.

Mystery Woven Into the Story.



It is around the marble room of the Senate, however, that real mystery and romance may be woven. One of the marble columns of the rotunda, when one looks at it closely, is said to be a natural portrait of George Washington.

Gambling, Favorite Pastime, Is Permitted in Peking for Period of Six Days.


